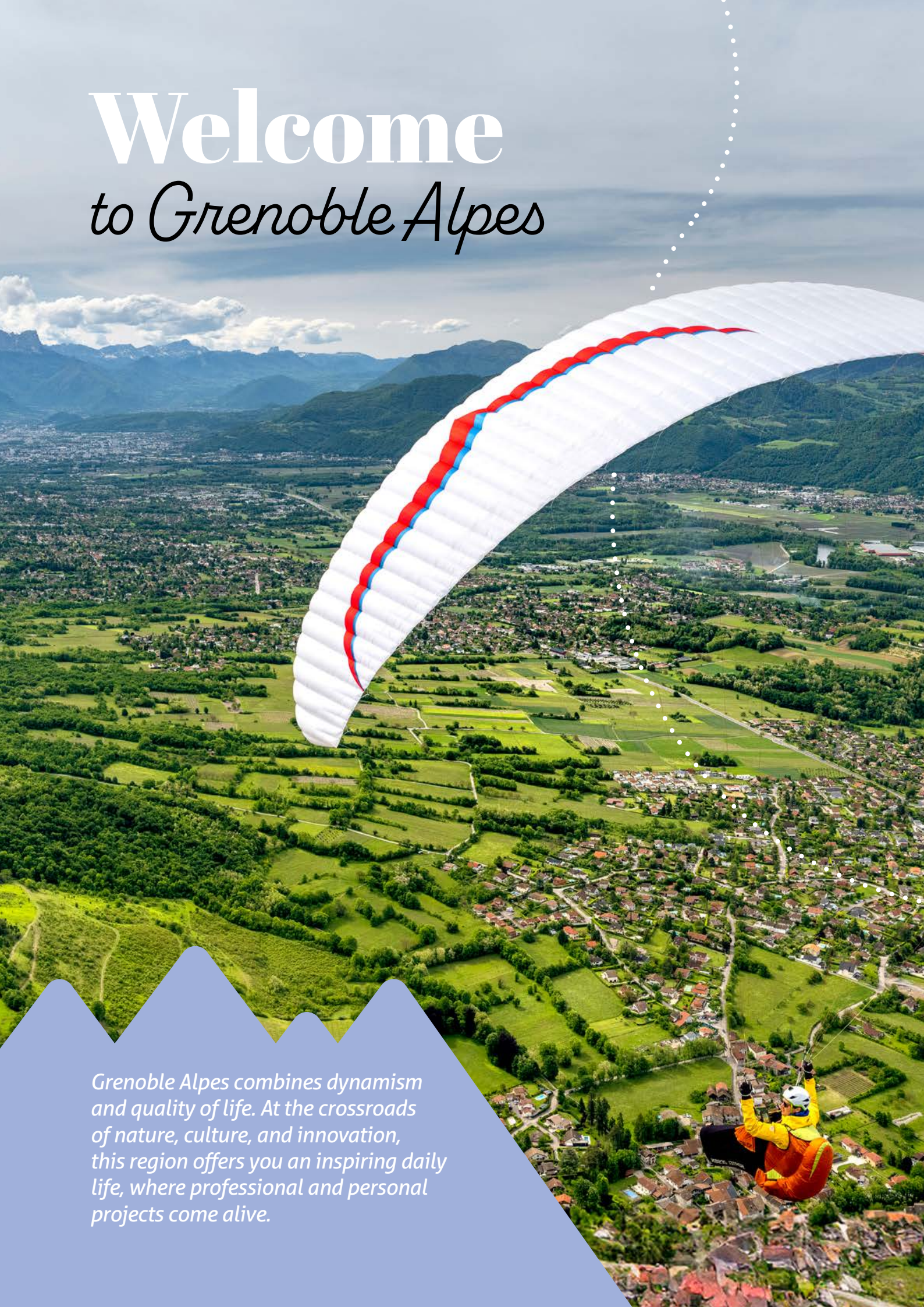

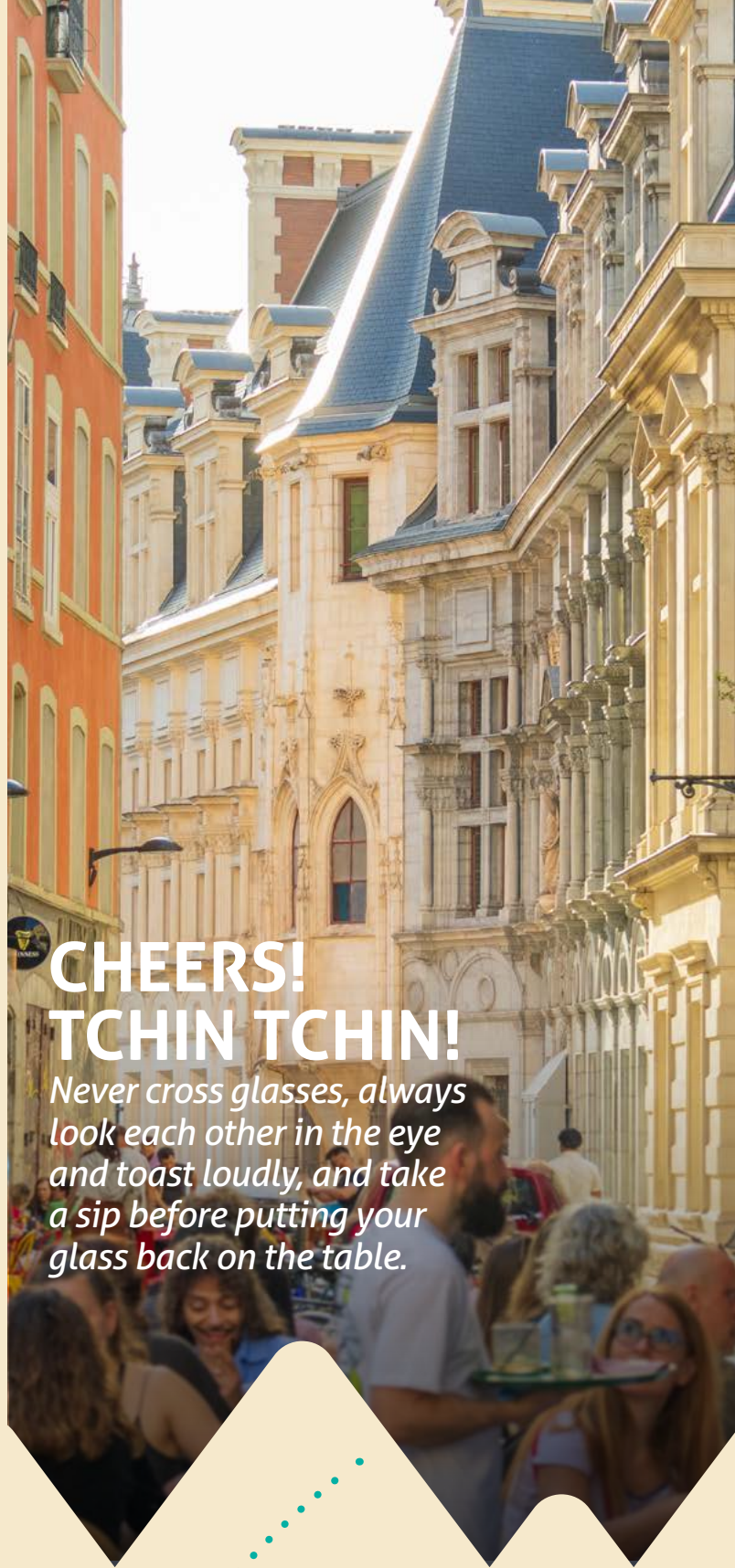

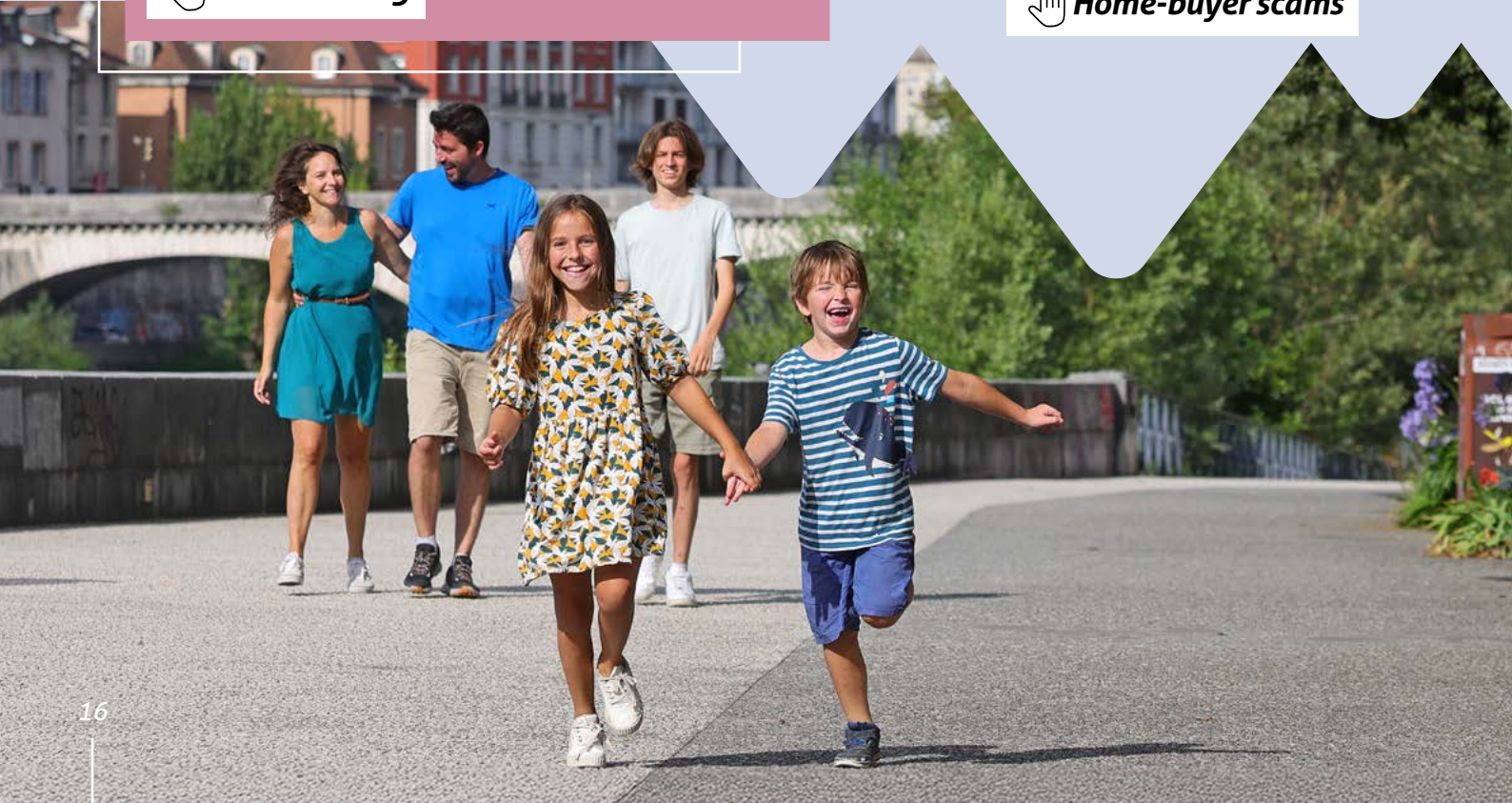

Health

In Grenoble Alpes, access to healthcare is simple, inclusive, and high-quality: municipal centers, multi-professional health centers, multilingual practitioners, and more. Here are the essentials for understanding the French healthcare system and easily navigating the Grenoble Alpes region.



Understanding the healthcare system in France

1

Registering for social security

Registering for **social security** is essential in order to receive reimbursement for healthcare. Once you are registered, you will receive a **social security number** and a "**carte vitale**".

Choosing a primary care physician

It is recommended that you designate a **primary care physician**, called a "**médecin traitant**", who will accompany you in your medical follow-up.

Have supplementary health insurance

Social security **only covers part** of your healthcare expenses. Supplementary **health insurance**, called a "mutuelle", tops up your reimbursements (consultations, pharmacy, hospitalization, etc.). Subscription is often offered through your employer.

From early childhood *To university*

Grenoble Alpes combines a structured national education system with local programs of excellence, from daycare to PhD. Take advantage of this to plan ahead for each stage and support your child every step of the way, from nursery school to graduation!



From 0 to 3 years old, childcare options and first steps

- **"Crèche:" Collective and family daycare centers**

From 0 to 3 years old, childcare options and first steps

- **"Haltes-garderies:" daycare centers**

These are facilities that provide occasional childcare.

They are useful for parents who need occasional childcare solutions.

- **"Micro-crèches": Micro-nurseries**

These are small facilities that take in a limited number of children (usually fewer than 10).

- **Certified childminders, "les nounous"***

These are professionals who look after children in their own homes.

They must be certified by the Departmental Council's Maternal and Child Protection Service.

A term of endearment used by children and families to refer to grandma or a nanny:

"We're going to Nounou!"



From 3 to 16 years old, schoolyards, hallways and classrooms

Until middle school, the first point of contact for any questions you may have about your child's education is the town hall where you live.

All procedures related to the French National Education System (school zoning, assignment, enrollment, exemptions) are handled by the Grenoble education authority.

Good to know

In France, public schools are free and secular, and education is compulsory for girls and boys aged 3 to 16 years old.

The school year begins in early September and ends in early July.

Preschool	3-6 years
Elementary	6-11 years
Middle school	11-15 years
High school	15-18 years

- Starting in middle school, students have the option of enrolling in specialized programs focused on music (CHAM), dance (CHAD), or foreign languages (SELO).

A pioneer in this field, Grenoble inaugurated the world's first wheelchair-accessible tramway in 1987, and its network remains a model of inclusion today.

Here, every journey benefits from a structured, dense, and interconnected transport system.

Train, tram, bus, bike, or walking: these modes of transport can be combined to meet everyday needs.

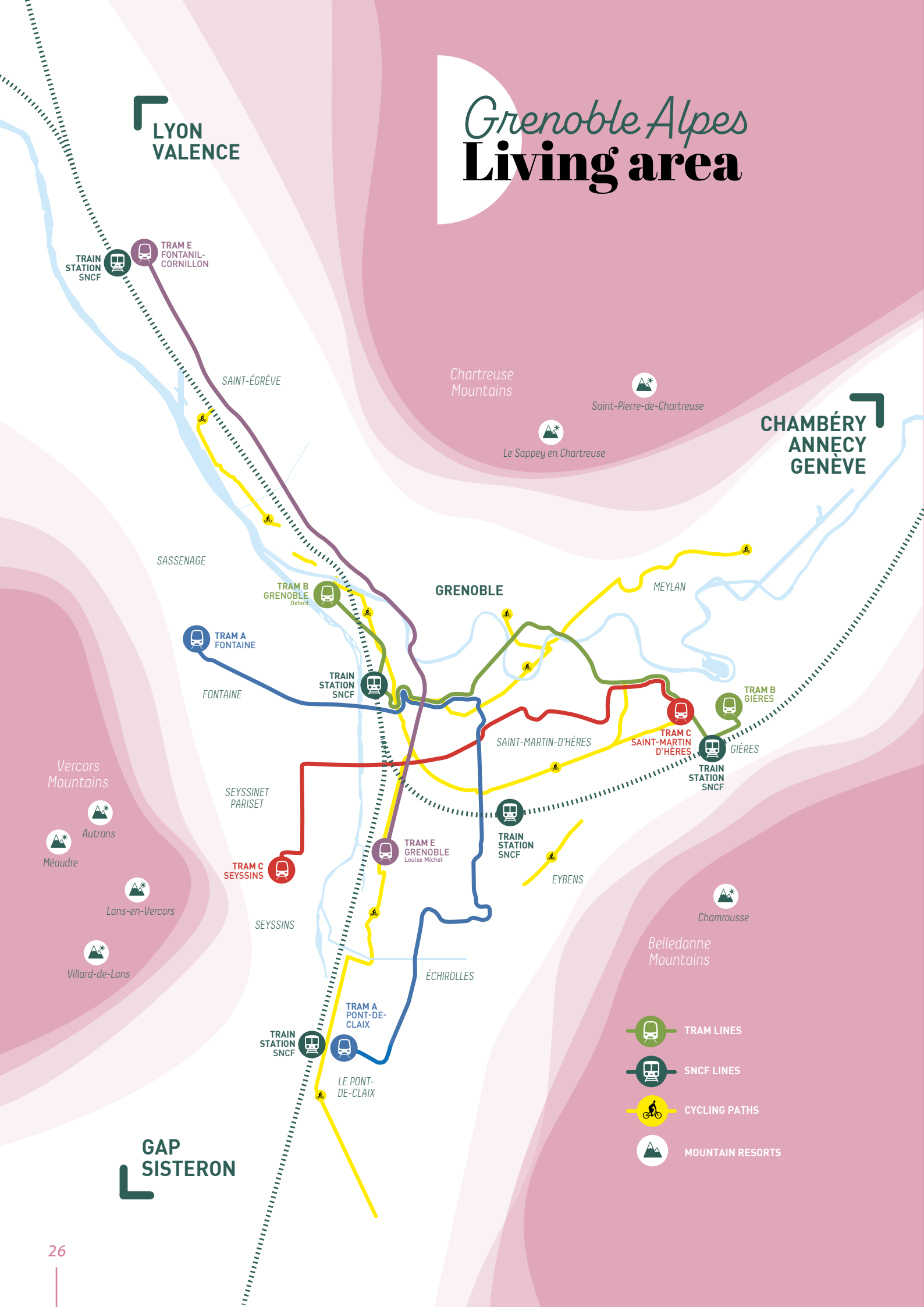

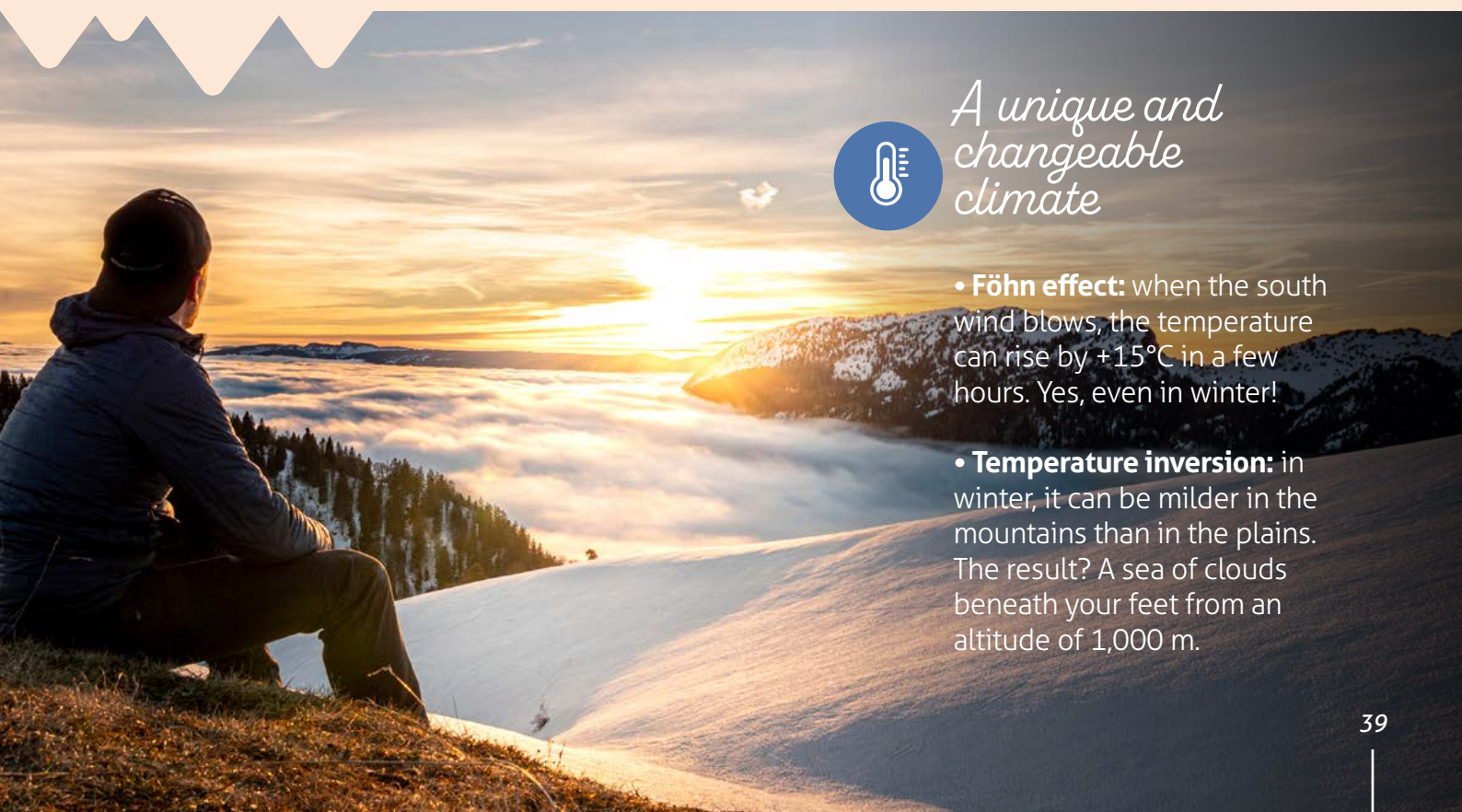


The **U**, because there's a 1 in 2 chance you have a bike (Grenoble is France's leading city for commuting by bike) and a 1 in 4 chance that you prefer buying to renting.

Even your car will need to wear socks, or even chains, to go to the mountains (mandatory for mountain passes in winter).

- **Föhn effect:** when the south wind blows, the temperature can rise by $+15^{\circ}\text{C}$ in a few hours. Yes, even in winter!

- **Temperature inversion:** in winter, it can be milder in the mountains than in the plains. The result? A sea of clouds beneath your feet from an altitude of 1,000 m.

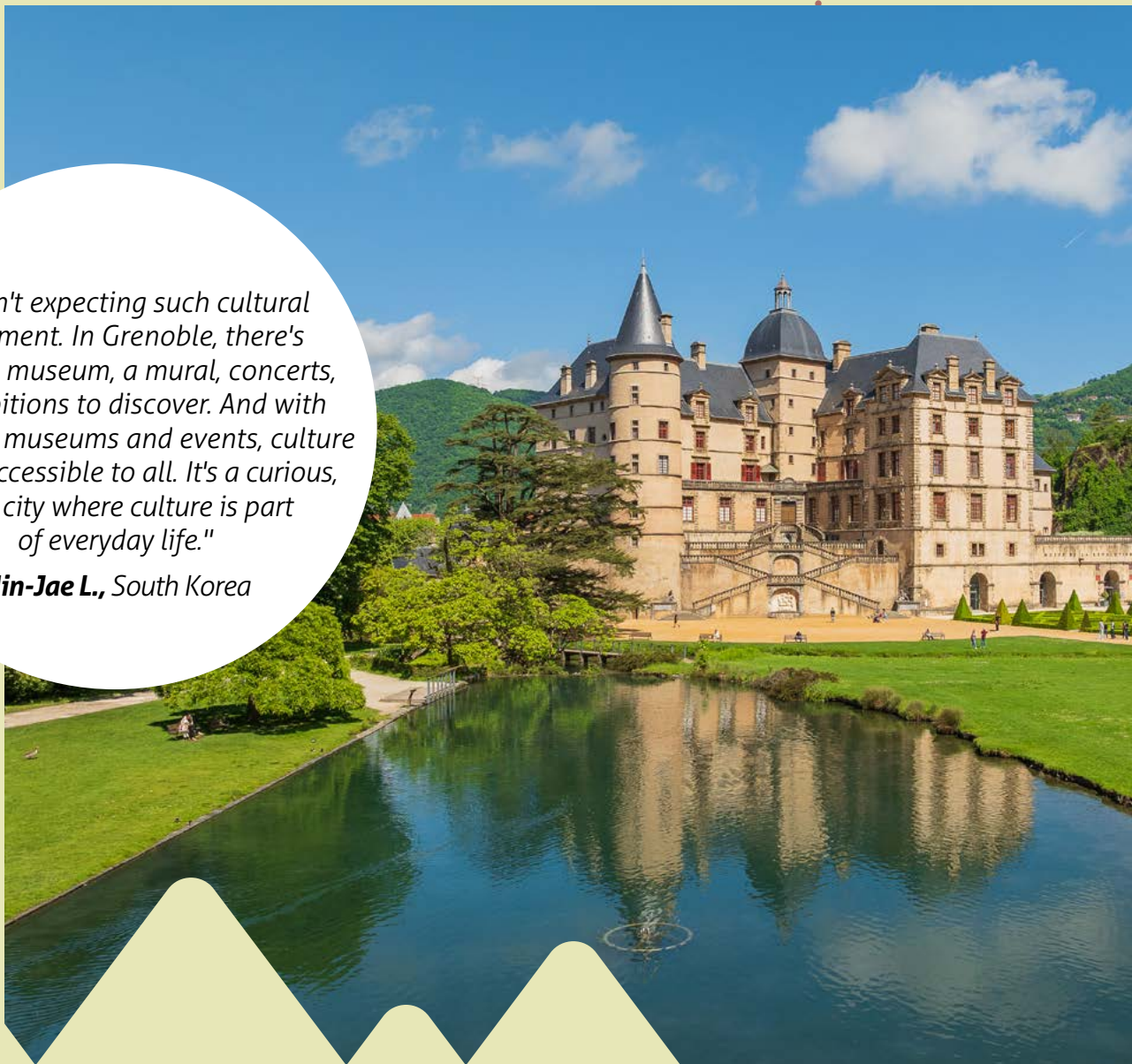

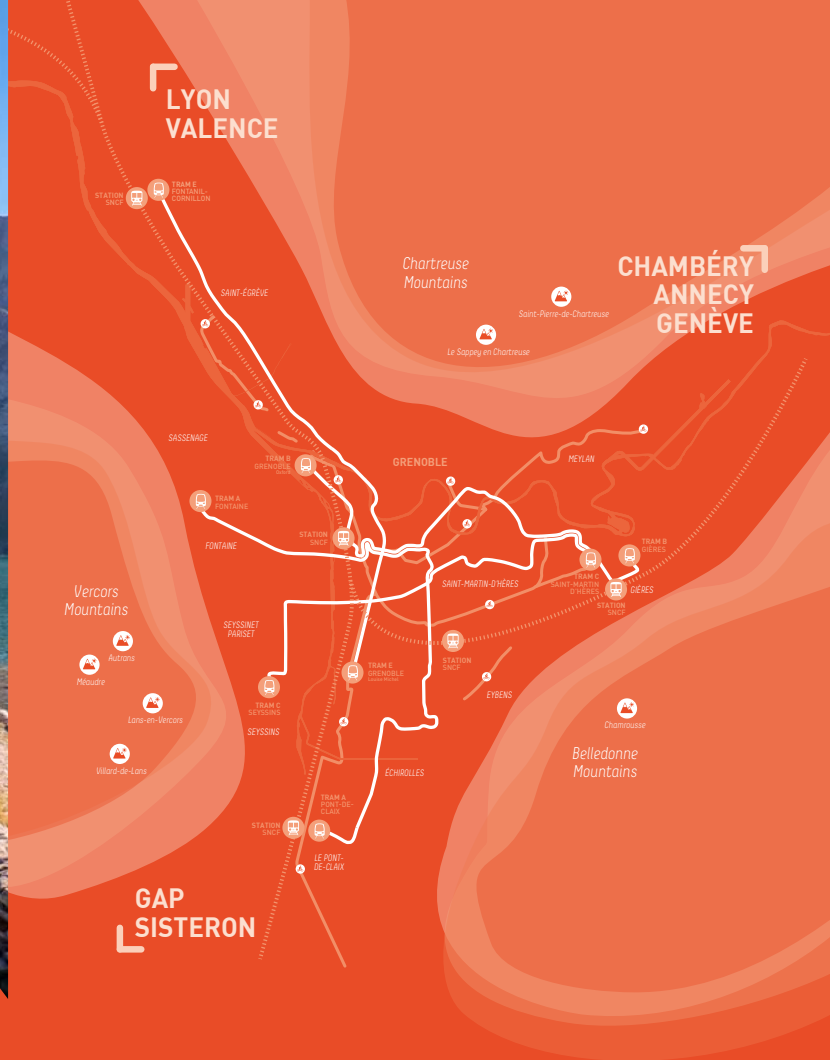
